After holding rates steady for three years, we are raising our rates for the 2019 tax season. If nothing significant has changed you can expect to pay the following for your 2019 tax return, based on what you paid for 2018. Please contact me if you have any questions.

I do recommend checking in with me in late October so we can do some tax planning, and hopefully avoid some of the surprises we had for the 2018 season. There will be a prorated hourly charge.
